Few things touch our hearts and souls like music. There is something about a well-crafted tune and the poetic expression of words that speaks to our emotions as well as our intellect. It is therefore not surprising that as far back as we can document, music has been incorporated into the worship of God.

The Book of Psalms has been called the "Hymnbook of the Old Testament." Most of the 150 psalms in our Bible are attributed to King David, who was a talented musician long before he became king of Israel. He composed out of joy and sorrow, expressing the moods and emotions that are experienced by every person. There are psalms of jubilation and of grief, psalms of wonder and of doubt. We don't know the original tunes anymore, but the words still speak to us and voice our own sentiments of worship.

On three Wednesdays during July (5th, 12th & 19th) at 6:00, I will be leading a study and discussion of some of our favorite Psalms. I will pick several to get us started, but then you, the participants, will get to choose your favorite to discuss. I hope you can come join us in Room 105/107.

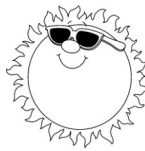
Broadus Youth: Belong! Believe! Become!
