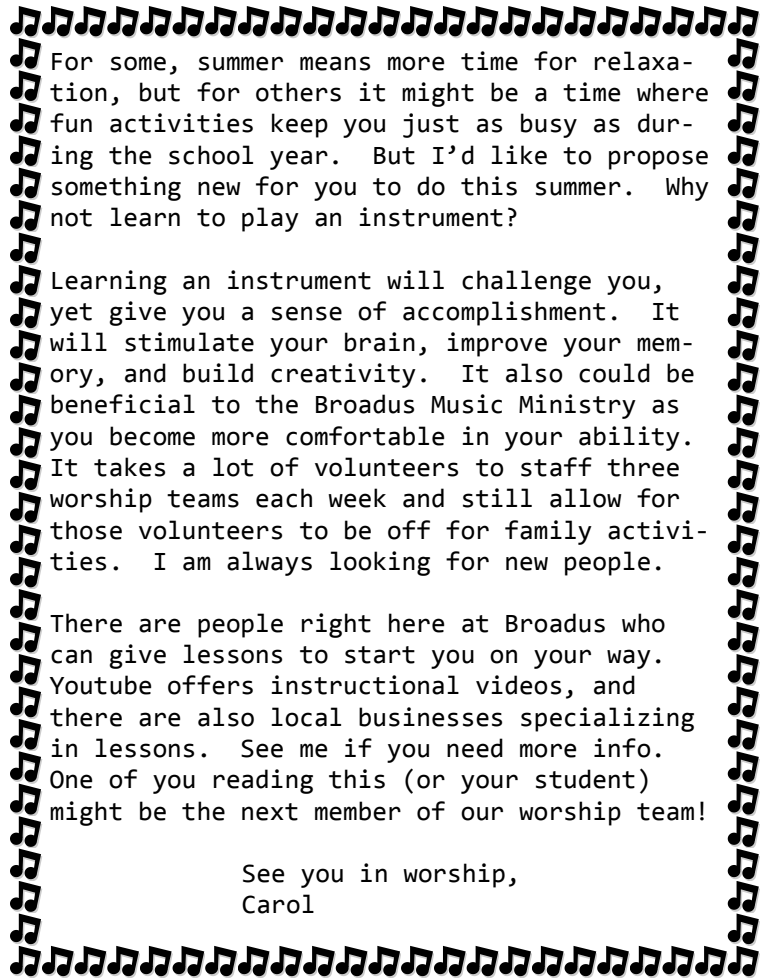
We had such a good time together at our Fellowship Day on the 5th Sunday of April, we are now making plans for another special event on the 5th Sunday of July!

A kind family from Hopewell Baptist Church in New Kent has offered to let us use their family property on the Pamunkey River as a spot for our church picnic and baptism. It is down Old Church Road, only about 20 minutes from our Pole Green Campus and 35 minutes from Hebron. All the details haven't been worked out yet, but I expect we will have the baptism first followed by a covered-dish picnic and fellowship time. I hope you will put this event on your summer calendar!

If you have been giving some thought to getting baptized, I hope you will talk to me or one of our staff about it. You shouldn't do it just because it looks fun, or you have friends who are doing it, or your family expects you to. You also shouldn't do it just because we are having a "river" baptism. Baptism is what you do when you have decided to live for Jesus, making Him your Lord and Savior. It symbolizes your death to sin and your new life in Christ. It is an act of obedience and a public declaration of your faith. Being dunked in water is a symbolic act, but it is also sacred and deeply meaningful. If you have not expressed your faith like this before, I hope you will consider if this is the right time.
