The great Methodist missionary, E. Stanley Jones, wrote about the very nature of prayer. He said, "Prayer is **DARAGRAPLS** surrender — surrender to the will of God and cooperation with that will. If

I throw out a boathook from the boat and catch hold of the shore and pull, do I pull the shore to me, or do I pull myself to the shore? Prayer is not pulling God to my will, but the aligning of my will to the will of God."

I'm afraid often in my life I have attempted to use prayer to bend God to my will instead of surrendering my will to Him. But in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus gave us the ultimate example of righteous prayer with his words to the Heavenly Father, "Not my will, but Thine be done." You know. that's not difficult to say, but it is mighty hard to sincerely pray! Letting go of our wants is never easy.

In our first meeting, the newly elected Vision Team sensed a need to put first things first. Instead of talking about goals, strategies, programs, buildings and events, we were drawn to the necessity of seeking God. After all, the vision we seek for Broadus Church is not our vision; it is His!

The Team asks that you join with us in this season of prayer. Different members have been writing down devotional thoughts related to prayer. These arise from their personal Bible study and experience, or from devotionals that others have shared. Beginning this month, we will be publishing a brief "prayer guide" in most of our weekly bulletins. It will also be available by email. We ask that you use the featured scripture passage and the accompanying thoughts to help guide your prayers for the week. The plan is to continue this throughout the visioning process—possibly the next 6-12 months.

We have also discussed initiating some special prayer groups. As these plans take shape, we will put out the word, hoping you will join us. A renewed desire to know and follow the Lord is surely the foundation for our church's bright future.
