Sometimes I struggle knowing what to put in the Dulletin's order of service to denote a time of sing-**1** ing. It's easy when we are singing from a hymnal to a call the song a hymn. But what if we're singing something that's not in our hymnal? Is it still called a hymn? Hoping for some insight, I decided to look up some definitions.

According to the dictionary, a *song* is a short musical composition of words and music. A *chorus* is **a** a part of a song repeated after each verse. A *hymn* is a religious song of praise to God. An anthem is a song of praise, adoration, or patriotism.

Well then, for years I've used the word chorus for the songs we sing in our contemporary service, but that description doesn't fit. Newer songs have verses with lots of meaning, not necessarily repetitive refrains. But what would one think if I called that song a hymn or an anthem? Is it only a A choir who can sing an anthem? Sometimes I've used the words special music, but isn't all music special when it draws our heart to God?

I know this is just semantics, but it does make for an interesting conversation. What should we call the songs we sing to God? Is it different if it's for personal worship or corporate worship? If one person sings it or a group? Does it depend on how long the song has been around? I'd love to hear your thoughts.
