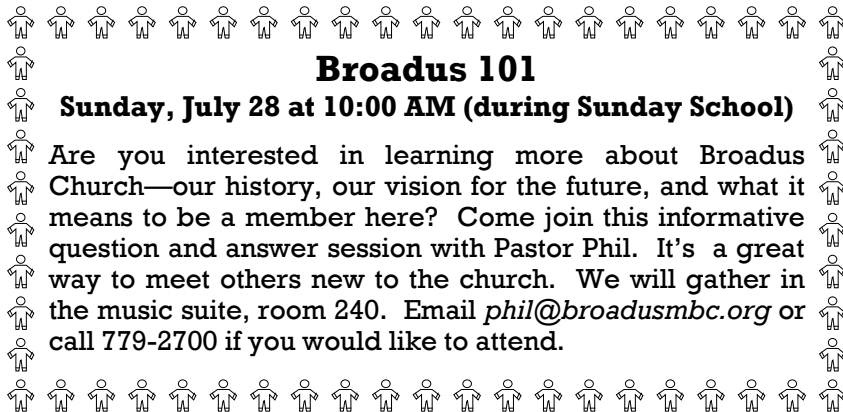

## Broadus Youth: Belong! Believe! Become!

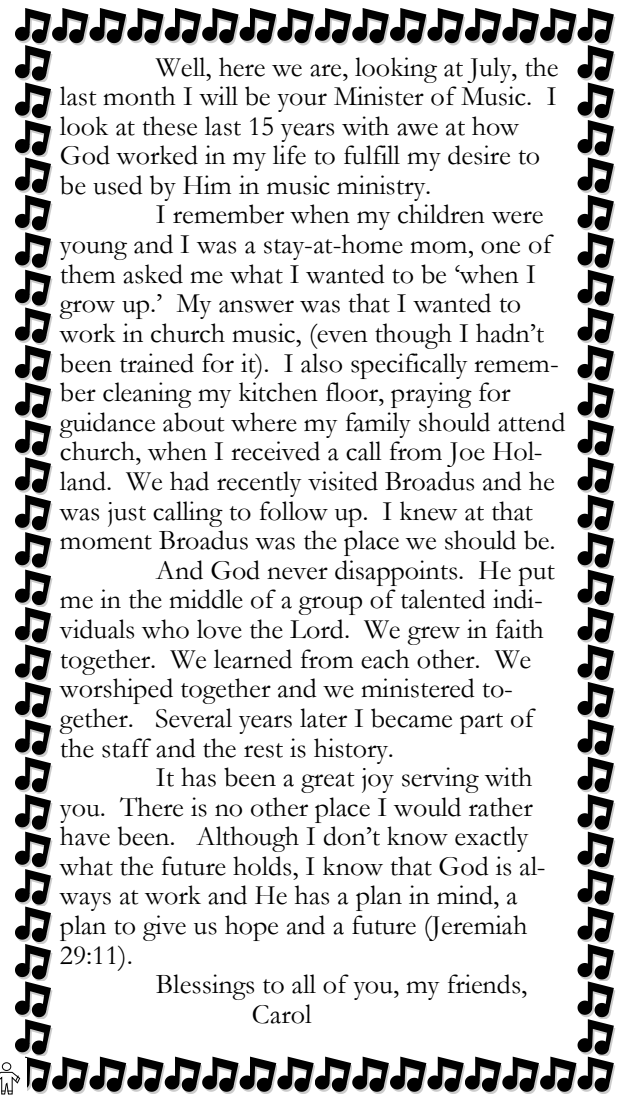
### COMING UP:
