Matthew 16:13-18 records for us a very powerful and theologically important interaction between Jesus and his disci-**PARAGRAPHS** ple, Simon Peter. In that passage, we hear a profound declaration of faith

about Jesus from the mouth of Peter: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" That declaration was such a breakthrough that Jesus told Peter he had received the revelation from heaven, not from any person. It is still the foundation of our Christian faith.

But there are other beautiful nuggets of truth in these verses. In response to Peter verbalizing the true identity of his Master, Jesus turns around and verbalizes the true identity of his disciple: "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah... I tell you that you are Peter ('Petros' in Greek), and on this rock ('petra') I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.'

According to John 1:42, it was Jesus who had early on given to Simon the new name (we might say nickname) of "Peter." He had in essence identified Peter as a rock-like individual—in the best sense of the word: strong, bold, dependable. The only problem is that as we read through the gospels, he is anything but. For every time Peter says something profound, he turns around and says something foolish. For every time he displays great faith, he also displays doubt. For every time he displays great courage, he also reveals his cowardice. That doesn't seem very rock-like, does it?

But in my understanding, Jesus named Peter not on the basis of who he was at that moment, but on the basis of who he was designed to be. Jesus saw his potential, and by naming him "Petros," he set the bar high. Peter didn't reach that high mark immediately, but he always knew God had chosen him for something special. Bit by bit, he learned to live up to his name!

What does this have to do with us? Well, we are an imperfect church full of imperfect people. But God and God alone sees us not just as we are, but as we should be and could be. Through our visioning process. He is setting the bar high for us. He wants us to reach our full potential. As with Peter, it is unlikely to happen all at once, but the journey upward is beginning. The God who began a good work in us will carry it on to completion through Christ Jesus (see Philippians 1:6).

I am thankful for a God who sees us not just as we are, but as we can be. He calls us higher, and empowers us for the task! It is my pleasure to be on this journey with you.
