Here we are at the beginning of November, which means we are only days away from 24-hour Christmas music on the radio! Aren't we missing something? I realize that a station broadcasting continuous Thanksgiving music up until the fourth Thursday of the month would have trouparagraphs ble keeping its revenues up. (I mean, how often do you want to listen to Come, Ye Thankful People, Come and Count Your Many Blessings.) But still, I think we need to be careful about

neglecting Thanksgiving. For us as Christians, worse than not observing the fall holiday is going through any day without acknowledging our blessings and expressing our gratitude to our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer.

A story is told about an old man who used to go out week after week to a pier along the Florida coast. He would bring with him a bucket of shrimp. At first he would be alone, but not for long. As soon as he reached into the bucket and began tossing shrimp around the dock, the sky would fill with the familiar forms of flapping birds. Seagulls would appear from everywhere—hovering above him, then landing on the dock and even on the old man himself. They knew this fellow. and loved to feast on the little delicacies he tossed out to them. I don't guess they ever wondered why he was doing it.

The old man's name was Eddie Rickenbacker. He was a famous World War I flying ace and Medal of Honor recipient who also played a role in WW II. It was in 1942, while carrying a message from the president to Gen. MacArthur, that his B-17 Flying Fortress transport strayed far off course and was forced to ditch in the South Pacific. He and the crew of eight were adrift in life-rafts for several weeks, braving sharks, dehydration and starvation. Most people had long assumed they had died, but only one would perish while they were lost at sea. Every day they would have a time of devotions and prayer, asking for God's help.

At the peak of starvation and despair, a miraculous thing happened. From out of nowhere, a seagull came and perched on their lifeboat. Rickenbacker was able to grab it, and the men thankfully ate the meat while using the intestines as bait to catch fish. That bird was key to their survival. And so, years later, Rickenbacker would go out to a pier with a bucket of shrimp, saying to God and the seagulls, "Thank you, thank you, thank you."

Every day, our hearts should overflow with that kind of gratitude. As we count our many blessings which include abundant and eternal life, we should go to God in prayer saying, "Thank you, thank you, thank you!" And like that bucket of shrimp, the attitude of gratitude should show itself in our generosity to others.
