

Sunday, February 9th at 10:00 AM (during the Sunday School hour)



screenings, pantry goods, clothing job/housing resources, a biblical message and prayers of Hope. At times, when the temperatures drop, they will provide a hotel room to the truly homeless for a night or two. The goal is for the homeless to find jobs and a place to live off the streets.

Just a few days ago, I was looking ahead on the church calendar to the month of February. It looked so empty I almost felt a little guilty about it. Almost.

I don't know how it was for you, but for me January was jam-packed—so many meetings, planning sessions, new programs kicking into gear! We're only one month into the new year, and I'm already tired. So after my twinge of guilt, I decided to look at February a different way. God didn't design us to run full-speed all the time. Maybe February can be a month of Sabbath!

The Sabbath is an ancient concept introduced to us by God Himself. Chapter one of Genesis tells us that on the seventh day of creation, God "rested from all His work. And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy." I think we can understand that God didn't need the rest for Himself; neither did He withdraw from upholding the world. But He knew we were going to need some down-time, and He set a powerful example. Of course, He went on to include the Sabbath in His Ten Commandments: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God."

Over time, men got pretty strict about how to apply this directive. But Jesus taught us how to fulfill the Law without getting legalistic about it. He showed how a time of healthy self-care should also be a time of worship and good deeds. We also see in the New Testament how it is not the particular day that matters as much as fulfilling the spirit of God's command.

The Sabbath is not a license to be lazy or neglect your Godgiven responsibilities, but please don't feel guilty about slowing down and taking care of yourself. He teaches us to do that, as well. You should have a day of rest built into every week, and maybe even a slower month now and then. It might even give you a chance to do some of the good things you've been too busy to do—like take more time for Bible study and prayer, visit a sick neighbor or play a game with your kids. Things like that can really help re-fuel you!

For full disclosure, I will confess that with every passing day the February calendar gets fuller and fuller. You know how that goes. But I have been reminded to prioritize a little better. Maybe less time focused on administration and more time focused on relationships, less time in the office and more in the sunshine, less putting out proverbial fires and more letting God's fire burn in me! I think that may make God and me a little happier.
