The Second Coronavirus Edition of Our Newsletter

By the time you receive this newsletter, we will have missed seven consecutive weeks of our regularly scheduled worship services, Bible studies, and other activities. These "distancing" procedures do have an emotional toll, but we've learned that God is faithful through every circumstance we face! We are through every circumstance we face! We are blessed that through modern technology we can still be connected even when separated.

Drive-In Services. Our first "drive-in" worship experiences were simultaneous sunrise services broadcast by radio at both campuses on Easter Sunday. They were a great success, with 140 cars and over 300 people participating! Since Easter, our Hebron Campus has continued to offer weekly drivein services at 11:00. The Pole Green Campus will hold drive-in services at 9:00 on May 10 (Mother's Day) and May 24 (Memorial Day Weekend). If we are still not able to gather indoors, we will also do drive-in worship on June 7 (Youth Sunday).

Worship Videos Online. We post weekly worship services to the website and our Facebook page. They are hosted on our YouTube channel: "Broadus Mechanicsville." This will continue even when drive-in services are offered. If you cannot access these online and would like a DVD mailed to your home, please contact the church office.

Moments of Hope Food Collection

Moments of Hope Outreach needs our help! Mo Hope is continuing their ministry to the homeless, elderly and others in need by holding drive-through food pantries. Grocery stores have stopped bulk purchases of canned goods because of the pandemic, so it is up to churches to fill the gap! Since we are not able to do our regular feeding ministry this month due to the coronavirus restrictions, Broadus Church is instead hosting a food drive for Mo Hope. Your generous donations will make a difference in the lives of our neighbors who are struggling the most.

During the week of May 3-9, there will be a collection bin in the glass entryway of the church. You may make donations at any time. Then at our drive-in worship service on Mother's Day, May 10th, you will be able to make a drop-off simply by rolling down your car window. What better way to honor the mother who fed and cared for you than by feeding and caring for someone else! The Hebron food collection will also help benefit this cause.

What will church look like when the gathering ban is lifted?



For the past couple of months, most of our discussions have centered around how to "do church" when we are not able to physically meet together. I think all-in-all we have responded pretty well to that challenge. But these restrictions won't be forever. So now the **PARAGRAPLS** important question before us is how we will "do church" when the ban is lifted.

Almost all experts agree that our first day back we will not be a "return to normal." The pandemic which took months to develop and reshape our society is not going to disappear overnight. The cautionary habits that people have developed are not going to be quickly cast aside, nor should they be. We need to come to grips with the fact there are some aspects of church life that have forever changed, and others that will more gradually return to the way they were.

For instance, our hearts might tell us that our first Sunday back ought to be a big celebration! Can't wait to shake some hands and hug some necks! How about making it a Sunday School high attendance day? Let's pack the worship center, have a big combined choir & praise team, and follow up the service with a delicious covered-dish dinner . . .

But we all know we cannot and should not do that, right? For one thing, it is very likely the ban will be lifted gradually. What if, for some weeks, groups over 100 are still prohibited? Or what if the cap is 50? What if the recommendation is still in place to keep a physical distance of six feet? What if it is still not wise for classes to be confined in a room together for an hour, especially if they are senior adults or have other health issues?

I don't mention this to discourage you, but simply to help us all be realistic and prepared for the days to come. Our celebrating will come in stages, not all at once! It is still too early to know when the changes will take place or what they will look like, but here are some possibilities:

- We may need to restructure our services and activities with smaller numbers in mind, at least in the short term.
- It's possible we will offer worship services before the Sunday School program resumes.
- The seating arrangement in worship may change to allow for more social distancing.
- The way we greet each other (handshakes and hugs), take up offering, observe the Lord's Supper and even celebrate baptisms may change—either temporarily or permanently.
- We will even need to evaluate how Wednesday night suppers are handled in the fall.
- We may have to trim our budget if giving falls short, or simply rearrange it to meet current needs.

On the bright side, there are some changes we will probably keep because they are beneficial to us:

- Weekly worship videos will likely continue to be posted to our website from our YouTube channel.
- More meetings will probably be done remotely, which is very convenient and cost effective.
- We will be utilizing the InTouch notification system and other useful technology we haven't had before.
- Maybe people will even have a new appreciation for the spirit rather than the ritual of worship, and an understanding of the church as *people* rather than a *building*.

God is able to use all this to His glory! These might be trying times, but the future is bright. I look forward to being with you more and more often in the days ahead. God bless you all!
