We have dramatically increased the number of backpacks we plan to give away. In 2019 it was 144, but now we are shooting for 200!



Even with much uncertainty about the fall schedule, underprivileged students need to be prepared and equipped. Many families are facing a greater financial crunch than ever before. They also need to know that God and the Christian community love them.

The church is able to get

backpacks for just \$12 each—and they come pre-packed with age-appropriate items for elementary, middle and high school.

So what's happening in the life of our church while the coronavirus is still hanging around? Our Church Council met via Zoom on June 23rd, and helped set the direction for the com-DARAGRAPHS ing weeks. These were some of the topics:

WORSHIP. Our Pole Green Campus began inside worship services at 9 & 11 on June 14th. For two weeks we have averaged about 100 people inside for worship, 40 worshipping from their cars in the parking lot, and others connecting on Facebook Live at home. We will continue with this arrangement—including social distancing and face masks—for a while longer. We expect our Sunday morning numbers to grow as it becomes safer for people to return to in-person worship, but we will continue to minister remotely to those who can't. One new development is that the Pavilion is being used as an outdoor, under-roof "listening station" where people can get out of their cars and—with social distancing—enjoy the service together through our FM 90.9 radio broadcast.

As Jeff mentioned in his column, the Hebron Campus will continue with 9:00 drive-in services through the summer. Unfortunately, we are still not able to offer nursery at either campus during Sunday worship.

SUNDAY SCHOOL. Sadly, our full Sunday School program will not be offered during the summer. But the good news is that a number of classes are finding alternate times and ways to meet! Look at the calendar or the Sunday School box on page 4 to see who is meeting. If you are not in a class able to meet, you are certainly invited to join with one that does.

CHURCH FACILTY USAGE. For everyone's safety, we are committed to following the directives of the state and CDC. This means that churchsponsored and outside groups on campus will need to follow the current safety guidelines. All facility reservations are subject to change if the virus risk increases and the guidelines change.

CHURCH OFFICE. The church office will continue to operate on abbreviated hours (Monday—Thursday, 8:30-Noon) for the rest of the summer. If you need to contact a staff member at other times, please leave a message on their church voicemail or call their cell phone.

CHURCH BUSINESS. Our church generally has business meetings every other month. But this year we have not had one since January! I appreciate the Church Council offering guidance during this time. Once again, we will not be having our regularly scheduled July business meeting, but if matters come up that require church approval, the Moderator will schedule a special "called" business meeting, and it will be announced to the church at least a week prior. Any in-person gathering or voting will be done in a way that is safest for the congregation.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS When the giving and expenditures through the month of June are calculated, we should have a good idea where we stand. It will be reported in next month's newsletter. Please continue in your generous stewardship. The mission and ministries of Broadus depend on our faithfulness.

OUR FALL SCHEDULE. It is difficult for us to yet know about our programs and activities for the fall—including Sunday School, Wednesday Night Dinner & Activities, a church picnic, the Fall Festival, and such. As with VBS, many things may have to be rearranged and re-imagined. Other things may have to be postponed or canceled until the virus threat is truly gone. The Church Council will meet again in August to decide.

GOD'S GOT THIS! One thing we know for sure is that God is in control. As we trust Him and seek His wisdom, He will lead us to spiritual growth and effective ministry even in these strange times. Our calling has not changed. Let's make disciples for Jesus by each one of us being a witness!

Hebron Happenings

God has been doing some exciting things over the last 3 months at our Hebron campus. We began offering our drive in service on Easter Sunday. We have not missed a Sunday since. We have moved our service time to 9:00 AM while averaging 40 people a Sunday. We simplified our services but it has allowed us to worship together while maintaining physical distancing.

Our Sunday School had been meeting through a phone-in service since internet is such an issue in KW. We recently added inperson Sunday School for Youth and Adults, with our youth using the trailer and our adults in the fellowship hall. We still offer the phone-in connection, but most people are coming in person.

On the mission front, we held a food drive and have a second one scheduled on August 22nd to support residents of KW and Winter's Point. We also held a drive-through parade for our neighbors at Winter's Point. We organized with the management team to give them a time. We rallied at the Food Lion in West Point, decorated our vehicles and let the management know we would be arriving in 15 minutes. The residents came out to their porches as we yelled about God's love and our love for them.
