

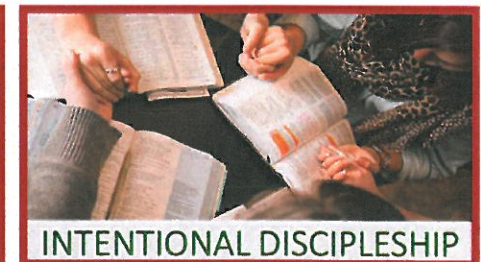
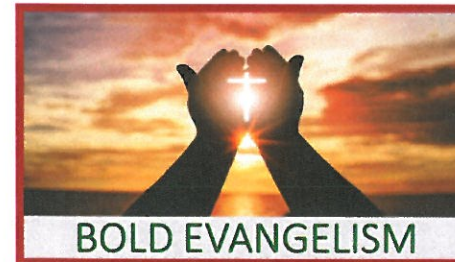

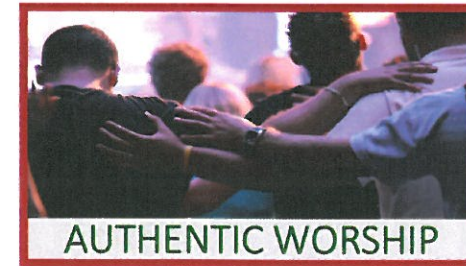

“Drive-In” & Pavilion Worship Service **Sunday, September 20, 2020 at 9:00 am**

- ◆ *If you plan to come out of your car and worship in the picnic pavilion, please park in the front parking area or the back gravel lot, leaving the closest “line-of-sight” parking for those staying in their cars. [If you have mobility issues, please park near the pavilion.] Folks in the pavilion or out of their cars must practice social distancing of 6’ from non-family members, and are also strongly encouraged to wear masks.*
- ◆ *To worship from your car, tune your radio to the posted FM frequency. (This is currently FM 101.1, but sometimes must change due to interference. If your reception is poor, try parking closer to the pavilion.) Park so you can see the stage, either from paved lot or the pavilion field. We ask that smaller cars park in front and larger vehicles in back.*
- ◆ *Children’s Bulletins are available from Ms Karen in the Pavilion. Get her attention to have them brought to your car.*
- ◆ *Receptacles for offerings and response cards are available as you enter and exit the front driveway, and at the pavilion.*
- ◆ *If you have a spiritual decision to share or would like to talk with a minister, please complete the response card and put it in an offering receptacle—or contact Pastor Phil this week.*
- ◆ *Bathrooms are available at the pavilion and education wing.*
