SERMON NOTES

"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16 (NIV)

All through the Bible we get glimpses of *A God Who Invites*:

- Come you who are thirsty, hungry, weary, and sinful.
- Follow me. Learn from me. Abide with me. Ask of me. Serve with me. Worship me.

Lessons from The Parable of the Great Banquet (Luke 14:16-24):

1. The invitation of God is for everyone.
2. The invitation is equally extended.
3. The invitation must be absolutely accepted.
4. The invitation should be urgently accepted.

Next Week is Palm Sunday

In our 9:00 worship service, we will use palm branches to commemorate Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. We will also complete our series called "John 3:16: A Portrait of God."

Holy Week Bible Study

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. This year, Pastor Phil will offer a daily devotional as a reminder of what Jesus did and taught on each of the seven days before Resurrection Sunday. A video will be posted to the church website each day. And for those who prefer an in-person experience, Pastor Phil will lead a brief daily Bible study (except for on Maundy Thursday) in the Worship Center at 10:30 am, beginning on Monday the 29th. Everyone is invited, with masks and social distancing necessary for a while longer.
