Mother's Day on May 9th

Mother's Day has historically been one of our larger Sundays here at Broadus. Of course, the virus has played havoc with our attendance, but we are still going to take this opportunity to remember and honor those who have played such a pivotal role in our development. The sermon that day will be "How to Honor the Women in Your Life," based on Proverbs 31.

As our in-person attendance has picked up we have been able to keep everyone safe through distancing, mask-wearing and cleaning. As we explore adding a 2nd Sunday morning service, we will also be increasing our outside ventila-



tion as weather permits. For now, we hope you feel safe to join us at our 9:00 am service.

Church Yard Sale Benefitting "Moments of Hope" April showers bring May flowers. Spring cleaning brings food and housing to those who need it!

Broadus will hold a church wide yard sale on **Saturday**, **June 5**th **from 7am to 12pm** in and around the picnic pavilion. All proceeds from the sale will benefit Moments of Hope (Mo Hope), which is a local ministry that feeds the homeless and assists in providing emergency shelter. COVID 19 has greatly increased the demand for services. According to Mo Hope officials it costs \$2-4/meal depending on partner contributions. The national average cost for emergency shelter is \$10/night, but because Mo Hope does not own a shelter the cost is \$60/night. They are working on establishing a housing village for this purpose. Your spring cleaning items can help in this effort!



We are accepting donations of gently used clothing, toys, furniture, household items and electronics (no tube TVs). For the month of May, donations may be dropped off on Thursdays from 10am-12pm or 6pm-8pm and



Saturdays from 10am-12pm. In order to prepare and price items in time for the June 5th sale, the final drop off date is Tuesday, June 1st from 10am-12pm and 6pm-8pm. Yard sale staff will be available to assist you. Pick-up is available for large furniture items or for those unable to lift by calling Brenda Dodson at 559-0414. We ask that all donations be brought to the church during one of the staffed times listed above. We are also in need of coat hangers and plastic bags. You may leave these in the labelled bins in the church Commons. Thank you in advance for supporting this good work! Start cleaning out, and we hope to see you at the sale!
