

The Tide Has Turned!

A couple of weeks ago, Governor Northam followed the lead of the

CDC in easing many of the restrictions related to the coronavirus. We praise the Lord that as vaccination rates have risen, there has been a dramatic decline in Covid-19 cases, hospitalizations and test positivity rates! The world-wide pandemic has not disappeared, but the threat is abating—and in some ways life is returning to normal.

So how does this affect life at church? From the beginning, we have been committed to following the safety guidelines of the state. Therefore, the Church Council has decided we can also honor the new freedoms. This is from the governor's announcement: "The CDC guidelines state that fully-vaccinated individuals do not have to wear masks in most indoor settings... Those who are unvaccinated or not fully-vaccinated are strongly encouraged to wear masks..."

The Council is aware that not everyone in the church is vaccinated, particularly among the children and youth who have not yet had the opportunity. Members, and especially parents, are encouraged to consult with their doctor about vaccines and masks. We want everyone to use their best discretion.

Also, as of the end of May, the state restrictions related to room capacity and social distancing have been removed. In worship, we will still try to provide extra space between rows, and we ask that you leave a couple of seats between yourself and those who are not in your "inner circle" of family and friends. The addition of a second Sunday morning service will help with this at the Pole Green Campus. If you are unable to find spacing options within your comfort zone, please talk with an usher, staff member or your Bible study teacher. We will certainly try to assist you. There is almost always a way to provide extra space for those who need it.

The Council would also like to remind you of some common-sense measures we should continue to follow. Please stay home if you are feeling sick, especially with any flu-like symptoms. (This is good advice whether or not we are in a pandemic!) Please continue good sanitation practices like washing your hands and covering coughs and sneezes. Please feel free to wear a mask or seek some additional "distancing" for extra protection.

The primary guideline we will be following at Broadus Church is, as Aretha Franklin would say, R-E-S-P-E-C-T. As brothers and sisters in Christ, we will respect the feelings and the health of those around us. We will respect differing opinions and practices. We will respect personal decisions about masks, vaccines, social distancing and close contact. (Reading body-language helps, but asking is the best way to know if someone is ready for a hug or handshake. Don't just presume.) We want everyone who walks through our doors to feel comfortable, loved and respected. This has been the goal of our church for generations, and it is what will continue to draw people into the fellowship and into the love of Christ.

In Galatians 5, the Apostle Paul taught the 1st century Christians not to use their freedom selfishly, but rather to "serve one another in love" (v. 13). He also said, "The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love" (v.6). Let that be our goal and practice.

Good things are happening around us! Let's capitalize on every opportunity and be thankful to God for seeing us through some difficult times. — Pastor Phil
