

It's hard to believe we are moving into the tail-end of summer already! It has been nice to have more safety and freeparagraphs doms than this time last year, but churches, schools and businesses are

still trying to navigate in a world where multiple variants of the coronavirus still exist. As we move into fall, plans are being made at Broadus to resume as much a sense of normalcy as possible.

Earlier this summer, we brought back our 11:00 Sunday morning worship service. Though the attendance has been small (30-60), we have been consistently having guests, and look forward to an uptick as summer vacations wind down. Our 9:00 service continues to average 130-150. For a sense of unity, we plan to continue our "blended" style for now. It is a blessing to bring new treasures as well as old from our musical storehouse! (Matt 13:52)

I appreciate that a number of our Sunday School classes were able to continue or resume during these months of Covid. We look forward to several new classes beginning on September 5th as we once again offer a full Bible study program. In the coming weeks, we will put out information about the classes and where they will meet. If you are not currently active in a Sunday School class, I hope you will make it a priority this fall.

There are so many other things we are working on, as well. The exact form of our mid-week ministry is still developing. I will be trying a hybrid approach (in-person & virtual) for a study of the Old Testament Patriarchs, and am hoping several other adult smallgroup studies will also be offered. We want to have programs for all ages as we have in the past, and possibly dinners too, but so much hinges on the level of interest from you, our church family.

This is a **call to action!** God is the source of the health and growth of our church, but He calls on all of us to do our part. We need to be good stewards so that the resources for our mission and ministry are available. We need to be participants so that the manpower is available. And we need leaders to step forward to teach and serve and guide new ministries. It's only by everyone stepping forward that we can staff our nurseries, start new classes, care for our facility, and reach the community for Christ! The Apostle Paul said we, as a church, are like one body with many parts—each having its own special function. Every believer has something to bring to the table. We've always needed each other, but I believe that's true now more than ever. Stand up and be counted, then watch what the Lord does!

Thank you for your patience during these trying times. We will not only make it through, but will grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18).

On October 9, 2016 the Hebron Campus of Broadus Church opened its doors. We faced a lot of storms to get opened: building renovations, property title issues (due to a county courthouse fire in the 1890s), lack of education space, and even impact from the remnants of Hurricane Matthew. Looking back it seems appropriate that we faced these issues since so much of the life of a church is putting out fires and following God during storms.

The Hebron Campus would not exist if it had not been for dedicated people from both campuses who helped us launch. I am grateful to so many people, but also for our church to take a huge step in opening a second campus. I am thankful for people who helped us navigate legal issues, survey the land, and work on the physical building. I am also appreciative of the core team from Pole Green who came to Hebron for a year to help us launch, and for a small group of believers who felt God had led them to start a new church in an old building in King William County. I continue to be amazed and thankful for every person God has sent through our doors in the last 5 years. My greatest joy is being your Pastor.
