It seems like all my life I have known the name Watchman Nee. paragraphs
It's unique enough to stick in one's memory, but until recently

his name is all I knew about the man. I now know his testimo-

ny and his teachings are worth some investigation.

This remarkable man was born in 1903 to Christian parents in Foochow, China. His mother had longed for a son, and kept her promise to dedicate him to the Lord when he was born. He was given the name *Nee Shu-tsu*, but following his conversion and call to ministry as a young man, he changed his Chinese name to To-sheng, which means "the sound of a watchman's rattle." In English, he came to be known as Watchman Nee.

Nee excelled in his university studies and began preaching during that time. He never attended seminary, but he dedicated himself to the study of the Bible and reading thousands of Christian books. An Anglican missionary in China helped to mentor him in the faith. From 1923 to 1950, Nee helped to plant 200 churches, most beginning in people's homes or rented buildings. He became well-known for his sermons, many related to the death and resurrection which believers experience in Christ. Over fifty books of his teachings have been translated into English.

Following China's civil war and "Cultural Revolution," his country became ardently communist and atheistic. Rather than flee or renounce his faith, Nee was arrested on false charges and imprisoned for the final twenty years of his life. During that time, only his wife was allowed to visit him. She died the year before his own death in 1972.

I'm giving you this brief sketch of Watchman Nee's life because beginning on October 16th, I will be sharing a 3-part sermon series called "The Process of Christian Maturity." I'm pulling many of my ideas from Nee's little book on Ephesians called "Sit, Walk, Stand." Each of those words represent a step in Christian maturity.

- Our position in Christ is to SIT with Him in heavenly places, an honor provided by God's grace, not our works. (Ephesians 2:6)
- Our life in this world is to WALK worthy of His calling upon us. (4:1)
- Our attitude toward the enemy is STAND against evil schemes and temptations. (6:11)

Watchman Nee's own life and martyrdom testify that he believed what he preached. I pray that as we explore Paul's letter to the Ephesians for ourselves, we will be drawn into a deeper and richer walk with the Lord. I hope you will be able to join us in worship. God bless!
