Elijah and the God of All Generations 1 Kings 19:19-21 & 2 Kings 2:1-15

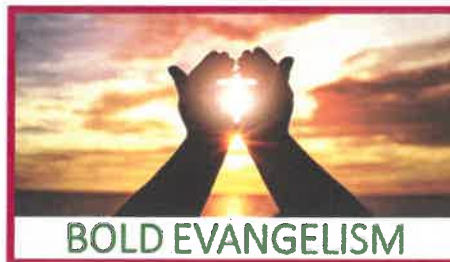
