#### "Making Each One a Witness"



This month, on the Sunday before Turkey Day, we will begin reparagraphs ceiving our Thanksgiving Mis-sions Offering. For those who

have been around Broadus a while, this is old hat. We're also accustomed to taking up a special offering at Easter. But for those who have come into our fellowship from a different Southern Baptist church, our system might seem odd.

You see, traditionally our brand of Baptists reserve the end-of-the-year holiday season for something called the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. Then in March comes the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions. (These and other offerings have been named after women who were instrumental participants and supporters of mission work.) Added onto the calendar are often at least two more-state missions and associational missions offerings-plus sometimes others like a world hunger offering. Before you know it, a new special offering is being promoted every couple of months.

To the best of my understanding, many decades prior to my arrival, the Broadus family decided enough was enough! They voted to limit missions offerings to two per year-Easter and Thanksgiving. Much to my relief, the "new" system has survived the test of time.

So who ends up with the money, generally a combined \$30K-\$40K annually? That answer is easy. Every year our Missions Committee makes a recommendation to the church about how those special donations get divided up and sent out. You can see our current break-down on the right column of this page. The Easter Offering is divided up in a similar way involving North American missions, state missions and associational missions. Though some designations change from time to time, what you can count on is that every cent you give to the missions offerings is sent out to our ministry partners locally and globally. None is kept here at our own church.

Our Hebron Campus recently had a missionary speaker highlighting how our gifts make a difference around the world. On November 13, the Pole Green Campus will be privileged to hear Paul Bishop from the International Mission Board for the same purpose. Let's take to heart what we learn, and give generously! Other people deserve to know about the love of Jesus. Let's make sure it happens!

- 25% World Hunger Relief


