SERMON NOTES

Meeting Jesus at a Party
John 2:1-11

According to the Gospel of John, the first miracle of Jesus was changing water into wine at a wedding feast. It might seem trivial to us, but no act of Jesus was without purpose. That particular occasion can teach us something about Jesus’ place in our social lives.

- ⇒ We should always be aware of Jesus’ presence, even in our recreation and celebrations.
- ⇒ We should be obedient to Jesus as he guides our words and actions.
- ⇒ We should be ready to experience his blessings with great joy!

A Few Questions to Ask Yourself about Leisure Time Activities & Behavior:

- Could this activity enslave me?
- Is there something edifying or beneficial about this?
- Could my behavior be a stumbling block for someone else?
- Can I use this for God’s glory?
- If Jesus were here with me, would he be pleased? (Hint: He is!)
