

Sometime in the next couple of weeks, we expect new chairs to arrive at our Pole Green Campus! I'm looking forward to the "facelift" paragraphs for our Worship Center, but at the same time, I appreciate the seventeen good years that our

old burgundy chairs (now different shades of burgundy depending on the degree of fading) have given us. With a rough estimate, I would say we've sat in those chairs for over 1500 worship services, and over 700 dinners—Wednesday nights and special occasions. (Wherever the old chairs end up, I suspect they will always carry 1000s of calories of Baptist food imbedded deep within the fabric!) Those chairs made it through countless funerals, weddings, concerts, Fun Fridays, youth lock-ins, business meetings, - you name it. And don't forget about those six seasons of The Living Nativity! Our old chairs have heard a lot of singing, praying, laughing, and even a little crying. I'd like to think they have also witnessed some life transformation.

But there are times for the old to go and the new to come. We are about to receive a truckload of chairs that are not only clean, unfaded and neatly stitched, but also full of sacred potential. What they witness in the next couple of decades is up to us.

My guess is that after we've sat in them a few times, we will forget about their newness. After all, they won't be so different than what we had before. What we sit on is not really that important, is it? Some of the greatest worship experiences have taken place while the people were seated on un-padded wooden benches, or on the ground.

Much more important than our furniture is the condition of our hearts. Just maybe, getting new chairs will remind us that we should come before God in a new way. Imagine what those chairs will witness if we come into worship focused upon God instead of the distractions of the world. Imagine what might take place if our hearts are humble instead of proud. Imagine what could happen if our expectation is to experience God instead of being entertained. This could lead to real transformation!

I'm thankful for the new chairs, but much more thankful for the new beginnings God offers us through Christ. Let's "enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise!"
