In just a few weeks, our family will be celebrating Cara's college graduation! Perhaps it shouldn't be, but it seems extra significant (and even a bit somber) since

she is our youngest, and there won't be anymore under-grad commencements to come. It's fun to mark these milestones with a bit of hoopla. A few months ago it was Melody's wedding, and before that was Seth's house purchase. Of course, we also celebrate birthdays—but if you think about it, a birthday just means you didn't die in the past year. But to actually accomplish something is a whole other thing to celebrate.

Amber and I sometimes think back to special moments when we knew our children's development was headed in the right direction. They all learned to walk, got out of diapers, figured out how to feed themselves, outgrew car seats, and learned to ride bikes. And of course, they also learned to talk, read, and do multiplication. I can't always remember in what order these accomplishments came, but I know they were important!

It's not all that hard to track childhood development, but it gets a little harder to track the milestones of spiritual development—not for our kids and grandkids, but for ourselves. In Colossians 2:6-7, the Apostle Paul wrote, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." In other places, he wrote about growing in faith, knowledge, and love.

When you learn to forgive a person who has wronged you, it's a milestone in your spiritual development. So is learning to consider your spouses feelings above your own, and telling the truth even when it costs you. It's important that we each examine ourselves. Be glad when you notice areas where you are becoming a little more like Jesus, and set goals where you are lacking.

God is a proud Father when He sees us maturing in the likeness of His Son. And nothing here on earth will ever beat His heavenly celebrations!
