Today I googled "Top Ten New Year's Resolutions." As you might imagine, not every list was the same, but certain resolutions popped up with

Maybe you and I ought to add to the list some resolutions that will encourage us to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus *Christ"* (2 Peter 3:18). Things like these:

- Spend more time studying the Word.
- Pray every day, but don't just ask for things.
- Be more consistent in church attendance.
- Find a new way to serve God by helping people.
- Join a small discipleship or accountability group.

This just scratches the surface, but you get the idea. If you put some real effort into your godly living, it will definitely pay off in every aspect of your life. God bless you with a terrific 2026!

Ten Years

January 1st will mark my 10-year anniversary with Broadus Church. Prior to my arrival, the important step of envisioning a new ministry in King William had already begun. It was my privilege to join the team and witness the beginning of the Hebron Campus of Broadus Church.

God's plan was definitely different from our plan. Our original idea was to be a church that attracted lots of young families—and I still hope we attract more young families—but it seems God's plan was for us to be a place where hurting people could be a part of a body of believers that would love them, support them and help them grow in their relationship with God and each other. During that time, we have grown numerically, spiritually and in service.

Some of the things that have been accomplished were part of the original plan. strengthened our Sunday School and Bible study ministry, and we have added a strong men's and woman's ministry that go beyond just a Bible Study. We've also added some things not in the original plan. Our food ministry feeds around 100 families a month, and our furniture ministry began to thrive during the pandemic. Just last year we added the Kids Outdoor Zone (KOZ) ministry. I see God adding some other ways for us to reach and serve our community in the near future. I hope you will pray for God's leadership and timing in these new ministries.
